If your portals are less revealing, try Cole & Son's 'Nowton Court' (left) and 'Barry Tracery' papers, from £1,500 approx per roll (with a minimum order of 10 rolls), and apply it yourself. 6 The north Norfolk coast can be parky, so Desmond MacCarthy takes no chances, having not one, not two, but three cast-iron radiators in the central hall (page 164).
